

# Fancy a budget dream wedding?

**OPTIONS:** Although wedding banquets in hotels in the Klang Valley are getting more expensive, there are cheaper alternatives for the budget-conscious, write Audrey Vijaindren, Suzanna Pillay and Nur Aqidah Azizi

ONCE upon a time, a dream wedding was to be cherished and planned with scrapbook images of little girls wearing star-studded veils and walking on red carpets adorned with a thousand rose petals.

Unfortunately, reality can be a bummer when the soon-to-be-happily-married couple realise that they have to cash out their savings and max out their credit cards to feed a few hundred guests at their dream wedding, usually a luxury hotel.

Over the past few years, costs of wedding banquets have doubled, no thanks to inflation, rising food and transport costs, as well as the Goods and Services Tax (GST).

Ilyum Weddings director Leticia Hsu says most couples are double-income earners and have many ideas on how they want to memorialise their big day.

"Some couples are willing to spend lavishly despite the rising wedding costs because they believe that they have to keep up with the Joneses."

"Many believe that they are expected to have a grand wedding reception."

Hsu says the increase in wedding price pushes guests to prepare bigger and gaudier packages.

"In fact, the rates of my peers these days don't even cover banquet costs. Most guests give between RM150 and RM250 for a seat, which is a big amount just for dinner. But for the couple, it barely covers the cost of the food."

"Unless you keep it to a standard copy-and-paste wedding package,

you'll end up spending more than what you will collect from the red packets."

"So, prepare your budget according to what you can afford. If you do collect more, then you will have a fantastic honeymoon. If you don't, at least you won't start your married life in debt."

But, she adds, it's not all doom and gloom for couples, as there are ways to bring the numbers down.

"Furthermore, with Wedding Incentive Points from Hilton, Ilyum offers packages that can earn thousands of bonus points that can be used for their dream honeymoon."

To shorten the to-do list, Hilton can even arrange for an official registrar to officiate the ceremony and offer special room rates for guests.

"For starters, have a dry dinner (no alcohol). If beer is a must, opt for a limited bar, which often only a signature cocktail. Opt for the expensive dishes and go for the cheaper options."

"Also, consider hosting a brunch or tea reception instead of a full-blown dinner."

"Couples may consider having an intimate dinner with close friends and family instead of a thousand guests. Have another cheaper informal dinner for colleagues and friends."

"We are planning to invite 1,000 guests and holding it in a hotel will be too expensive."

Hilal rental costs Noordin (RM10,000), which includes tables and chairs, sound system, lighting and decor. Food is RM25 per person.

For couples looking for more options, Leisure company Starwood Malaysia has 10 hotels across six brands in Malaysia.

"Luxury Collection, The Westin, Le Meridien, Shangri-La and the upcoming St. Regis are a perfect fit for couples with a bigger budget."

Cindy Chang of Nuptus & Such says although costs of wedding banquets have increased, couples will continue holding their weddings in their preferred venues.

"For those on a tight budget, Aloft and Four Points by Sheraton hotels are good options."

"Couples tend to look at how best to stretch their ringgit. Therefore, offering value for money is important," says


Wedding planner Sherly Abdul Aziz A from Tuu The Knot says prices of wedding banquets at hotels have been high for the past few years.

"Before GST, most five-star hotels were charging above RM2,000 per table. Even tables in reputable Chinese restaurants are between RM1,200 and RM1,800 each. Prices have increased by 10 to 15 per cent."

She says in comparison, Indian and Malay weddings tend to be cheaper because of the outcome.

Sherly says for wedding dinners in hotels, ang pow between RM150 and RM300 is acceptable, while for other venues, one will not be frowned upon for giving between RM80 and RM100.



## Unique weddings at 'Kampung Pengantin'

THE increasing costs of hotel weddings have directed couples to celebrate elsewhere.

Special venues for brides and grooms to commemorate their special day, dubbed Kampung Pengantin (Wedding Village), are making brisk business in the city outskirts.

At Rybba Haven, Nilai, clients can customise their special day from themes and colours to decor and food.

Unsurprisingly, it has become a popular choice for those who wish

for some exclusivity on their big day.

Its manager, Khairil Azman Mohamed Rostan, 48, says its popularity among couples is due to its location on top of a hill in Nilai Perdana.

"Besides the venue, we also provide other wedding services in our package, such as wedding dress, performances, food and photography."

"A typical package starts from RM30,000 and can go as high as RM50,000."

Khairil says customers are not deterred by the challenging economy.

"What they pay is what they get. Our customers have told us that they are satisfied with our services."

Muhammad Adiba Ismail, owner of Norts Event & Canopy, says his four-year-old business has boomed.

"There were challenges, especially last year."

"At a time when other companies were forced out of business, I am grateful that my company has survived."

Adiba says he has to tweak his

packages to account for the economy.

"Wedding packages are in demand, especially among brides-to-be. But we have to lower the price and customise our packages based on the needs of our customers."
